Honors Individuals Whose Contributions Impact EDA

SAN JOSE, Calif. and NEW YORK — May 30, 2012 — Nominations are being accepted now through Saturday, June 30, for the Phil Kaufman Award for Distinguished Contributions to Electronic Design Automation (EDA) sponsored by the [EDA Consortium \(EDAC\)](#) and the [IEEE Council on Electronic Design Automation \(CEDA\)](#).

The award, to be presented at a dinner ceremony this fall in Silicon Valley, Calif., recognizes individuals whose contributions made an impact within EDA in business, industry direction, promotion, technology and engineering, educational or mentoring. Impartiality is provided to all nominees, without regard to race, gender, age or national origin.

Established in 1994, the award is in honor of EDA industry pioneer Phil Kaufman, who turned innovative technologies such as silicon compilation and emulation into businesses that

have benefited electronic designers. Last year's recipient was Dr. C. L. (Dave) Liu, former president of the National TsingHua University in Hsinchu, Taiwan.
